UK Loans – UG & PG

Undergraduate	Postgraduate
Cover partially or in full undergraduate tuition fees	Maximum of £11,222
Can be integrated with Maintenance Loans and Maintenance and Special Support Grants (UK students only)	Can be integrated with scholarships
Start repaying (with interests) only when your income is over £2,214 a month	Start repaying (with interests) only when your income is over £1,750 a month

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UK Loans – Brexit



EU students starting their degree in starting in academic year 2021-22 will lose their 'home fees status'



What does it mean?

- Loss of eligibility for UK student loans

Anton's story

- Tuition fee loan from Student Loans Company (SLC)
- Scholarship of German Foundation:
 Deutsche Bildung
 (German Education)
 - ✓ 300€ per month for 3 years, up to450€
 - ✓ Vast extra-curricular programme
 - ✓ "Social-Fee" pay-back, individually adjusted
- My advice:
 - ✓ Do your Research!
 - ✓ Do not be disheartened if everything does not work out perfectly at first





Lea's story

- Tuition fee loan from Student Loans Company (SLC)
- Scholarship of German Foundation supported by German government:

Stiftung der Deutschen Wirtschaft

(Foundation of Germany Business)

- ✓ "Book money" 300€/month + need-based amount (up to about 600€)
- √ Vast extra-curricular programme
- My advice:
 - ✓ Make sure you understand application criteria
 - e.g. volunteering experience, grades, foundation-specific values
 - ✓ The application process might be tedious, but worth it!

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Irene's story

- Tuition fee loan from Student Loans Company (SLC)
- Scholarship of London Interdisciplinary Social Science Doctoral Training Partnership (LISS DTP):
 - ✓ Masters programme tuition fees covered
 - ✓ Stipend £1400/month approx.
 - √ Vast extra-curricular programme
- My advice:
 - ✓ Plan in advance!
 - ✓ Seek advice from your professors
 - ✓ Don't be afraid to apply!
